Call to Worship

L: Christ is Risen!

C: He is risen indeed!

L: This is the day the Lord has made.

C: Let us rejoice and be glad in it!

L: This is the day of hope. A day of great joy. Christ's tomb is empty. God has conquered death and brought new life. Rejoice O people of God for Christ is Risen!

(All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.)

L: Faithful and just God,

- C: We confess that we are captive to doubt and fear, bound by the ways that lead to death. We have not loved our sisters and brothers as you have first loved us. Forgive us, God of mercy. Let your Holy Spirit work in us to change our lives and make us new, that we may know the abundant life given in Christ Jesus, our risen Lord. Amen.
- L: Christ suffered for sins once for all in order to bring you to God. Now you are God's people; now you have received mercy. In the name of the risen + Lord Jesus, I declare to you that your sins are forgiven. Lay aside guilt, put away shame, for you are chosen and precious in God's sight. Live in the marvelous light of Christ. Amen.

Prayer of the Day: O God, you gave your only Son to suffer death on the cross for our redemption, and by his glorious resurrection you delivered us from the power of death. Make us die every day to sin, that we may live with him forever in the joy of the resurrection, through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Psalm 118:1-2, 14-24

¹Give thanks to the Lord, for the Lord is good; God's mercy endures forever. ²Let Israel now declare, "God's mercy endures forever." ¹⁴The Lord is my strength & my song, & has become my salvation. ¹⁵Shouts of rejoicing & salvation echo in the tents of the righteous: "The right hand of the Lord acts valiantly! ¹⁶The right hand of the Lordis exalted! Epistle Lesson: Colossians 3:1-4 ¹If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ²Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, ³for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

Gospel Reading: John 20:1-18 ¹Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. ²So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." ³Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went toward the tomb. ⁴The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. ⁵He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, ²and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. ⁵Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; ³for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. ¹OThen the disciples returned to their homes. ¹¹But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; ¹²and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. ¹³They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." ¹⁴When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. ¹⁵Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you looking for?"
