

Verse 1





<u>Updates on reopening in person:</u> Council met via Zoom meeting June 3rd. It was decided that we will meet for worship outside at Zion on Thursday, June 18th at 7:00PM. In the event of bad weather it will be canceled. We will reevaluate after this service to see if it is something everyone wants to continue with. Please bring your own chairs or blankets to sit on. We ask that everyone attending keep their 6ft distance from those whom you do not live with. Masks are recommended, please bring your own. We will have more details to come regarding a sign in sheet and how communion will work. We will have individually wrapped wafer and grape juice all in one for communion. Sunday services as of now at St. Luke's will remain online as we have been doing. Council is continuing to discuss and plan how we can safely worship at St. Luke in person again.

<u>Call Process:</u> The committee has called the first list of pastoral candidates and are waiting to hear back with their questions before moving on to the next step. We'll keep the congregation updated as they move forward with this process.
