#### Confession and Thanksgiving for Baptism:

P: In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

P: Joined to Christ in the waters of baptism, we are clothed with God's mercy and forgiveness. Yet even as baptized children of God we often fall short. We do not love others as we hope to love and we sin against God & neighbor in thought, word, and deed. Tonight, we confess our sins, claiming our baptismal promises and trusting in the power of Christ to forgive and make us new. *Silence for reflection and self-examination.*

**Reading - Introduction to Luther's Small Catechism:** Deuteronomy 6:1-9 *read by Maya Roschen*

<sup>1</sup>These are the commands, decrees and laws the Lord your God directed me to teach you to observe in the land that you are crossing the Jordan to possess, <sup>2</sup>so that you, your children and their children after them may fear the Lord your God as long as you live by keeping all his decrees and commands that I give you, and so that you may enjoy long life. <sup>3</sup>Hear, Israel, and be careful to obey so that it may go well with you and that you may increase greatly in a land flowing with milk and honey, just as the Lord, the God of your ancestors, promised you. <sup>4</sup>Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. <sup>5</sup>Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. <sup>6</sup>These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. <sup>7</sup>Impress them on your children.
